

If a student or staff tests positive for COVID-19 –

- Submit [COVID-19 Exposure Report](#)
- Isolate from all MCC property and activities for 10 days starting from the first day of symptoms or the date the positive test was administered (whichever was first).
- Isolation may end in 10 days if the person has been fever-free for 24 hours (without using fever reducing medication), and other symptoms are improving (other than loss of taste/smell).

If a student or staff member is exposed to COVID-19 –

If up-to-date (defined below) with COVID vaccination-

- Submit [COVID-19 Exposure Report](#)
- No quarantine is required so long as the person remains symptom free
- If any symptoms develop, begin isolation immediately, submit [COVID-19 Exposure Report](#), and get tested for the virus
- If no symptoms occur, testing is recommended at least 5 days after last close contact with infected individual

If NOT up-to-date (defined below) with COVID vaccination-

- Submit [COVID-19 Exposure Report](#)
- Quarantine from all MCC property and activities required for 10 days from time of most recent exposure to infected individual
- Testing is recommended at least 5 days after last close contact with infected individual
- If symptoms develop, begin isolation immediately, submit [COVID-19 Exposure Report](#) and get tested for the virus

Up-to-date definition-

Completed 2-dose series of COVID-19 vaccine (Pfizer or Moderna) within the past 6 months

Or

Have received the J&J vaccine within the last 2 months

Or

Have had one of the primary series of vaccines (Pfizer, Moderna, or J&J) and have been boosted

* Individuals who have been exposed to the virus and have had a confirmed case (through testing) of COVID-19 in the past 90 days are not required to quarantine from campus.

Staff that is experiencing COVID-like symptoms, has tested positive for COVID, or have had an exposure, please contact HR immediately following your submittal of the [COVID-19 Exposure Report](#) to discuss remote work and leave options.

Morgan Community College leadership established these processes following consultation with local health officials and reviewing current CDC guidelines. Should CDC guidance or local health conditions change, these guidelines may be adjusted as necessary.
