- 1. MCC held its 2024 commencement ceremony in Fort Morgan's Glenn Miller Park on Saturday, May 4. Over 300 students applied to graduate, with 177 participating in the ceremony.
- 2. The College held a gathering May 1 to celebrate MCC student award recipients. Awards in honor of some of MCC's first faculty members were presented:
  - Gene Ziegler Outstanding Occupational Student Award: Holly Lewis
  - Jean Danford Outstanding Student Leadership Award: Kenneth Sulley
  - Carolyn Thornsby Outstanding Student Academic Award: Courtney McFarland

In addition, Enrique Contreras-Mares received the Presidential Outstanding Student of the Year Award.

- 3. A "Star Party" was held for the community the evening of May 9 at the Fort Morgan campus. The event featured a mobile unit from MESO (Mobile Earth and Space Observatory) and provided an evening of hands-on STEM activities and stargazing for all ages.
- 4. A "Topping Off" ceremony for the Dahms-Talton Center for Skilled Trades & Technology was held May 7. The event celebrated reaching the phase in construction when the final I-beam was raised. Participants in the ceremony were given the opportunity to sign the beam before it was placed.
- 5. A state-funded controlled maintenance project replacing HVAC rooftop units (RTUs) for Cottonwood Hall, Aspen Hall, and 300 Main will occur before the beginning of summer semester.
- 6. The [Linda] Camp-Johnson Endowment was created with the MCC Foundation. The endowment will fund annual scholarships of \$1,500 for selected MCC students enrolled in Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs.
